Sandra and Jerry Martin Endowed Scholarship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Four-year award Awarded to an incoming first-year student with high academic achievement. Must be a North Louisiana resident living in a municipality with 40,000 residents or less. 	\$2,000
Charles G. Hargon Jr. Memorial Scholarship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Awarded to a fourth-year medical student. Based on a high academic standing, volunteerism in student service projects, faith-based activities, or a non-profit in the North Louisiana community while enrolled at LSU Health Shreveport. Non-renewable 	\$4,000
LSU Rotary Club Scholarship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The School of Medicine Scholarship committee provides 3 nominees to the Shreveport Rotary Club for consideration.
